
CONFLICT MINERALS STATEMENT

McMullin Manufacturing is committed to social and environmental responsibility in our activities as well as within our supply chain.

In 2010, the U.S. Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act was passed concerning “conflict minerals” originating from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries. The SEC published final rules associated with the disclosure of the source of conflict minerals by U.S. publicly traded companies. The rules reference the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from the Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas, which guides suppliers to establish policies, due diligence frameworks and management systems.

Currently the list of conflict minerals consist of Gold, Tungsten, Tin and Tantalum. The U.S. Secretary of State may designate other minerals in the future.

In our commitment towards the promotion of transparency and consumer awareness regarding these issues, McMullin Manufacturing Corp. has enacted the following policies:

- **We do not knowingly procure any products containing Conflict Minerals from the Conflict Region.**
- **We ask our suppliers to use raw materials sourced from Conflict-Free regions.**
- **If we become aware of the use of Conflict Minerals in our supply chain, we will work with our suppliers to find alternative conflict-free sources.**

McMullin Manufacturing encourages our suppliers to adopt similar policies to ensure that the specified materials are only being sourced through mines and smelters that are considered Conflict-Free.
